COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will focus on the new developments and challenging entities in gynecologic pathology. Updates on squamous lesions of the vulva, including HPV negative epithelial lesions/tumors will be discussed. A didactic style lecture on the implications of updated endometrial staging will be presented. High yield topics like endometrial intraepithelial neoplasia and interpretation of cervical biopsies will be covered, including morphological criteria for diagnosis, use of immunohistochemistry and differentials for ambiguous cases. Ovarian tumors including low-grade serous carcinoma and primary neuroectodermal tumors will also be discussed. New and emerging biomarkers for gynecologic pathology will also be reviewed. The course will feature live lectures, with opportunities for questions and discussion, as well as presentations of illustrative and challenging cases.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Appreciate the role of molecular testing in ovarian cancer, especially rare subtypes such as low-grade serous carcinoma.
- Characterize the role of HRD testing, MSI and other molecular markers in choosing therapies for tumors of the gynecologic tract.
- Identify the major morphologic subtypes of vulvar carcinoma, both preinvasive and invasive.
- Know how the presence of HPV modifies the risk of recurrence in vulvar cancer.
- Understand how our practice might change with the introduction of new endometrial carcinoma staging.
- Define the major morphologic pitfalls in diagnosing preinvasive carcinoma of the myometrium (endometrial intraepithelial neoplasia).
- Select and interpret immunostains and molecular tests for differential diagnosis.
- · Recognize common and unusual cervical lesions in biopsy specimen.

This course is intended for practicing pathologists (attendings) or fellows, especially those with a subspecialty interest in gynecologic pathology.
